

Politicians at all levels make headlines in 2018

Simcoe Grey saw much political change in 2018 - not in the politics but in the politicians.

The riding remains true blue but all three levels of government have made headlines in 2018.

Federal

The year began with Conservative Party approval for two Simcoe County residents to challenge sitting MP Kellie Leitch.

Area obstetrician and gynecologist Gillian Yeates and Essa Mayor Terry Dowdall received approval to challenge Leitch for the national Conservative Party nomination for the Simcoe-Grey

Later in January, Leitch announced she would not seek re-election.

In a statement she said she would complete her current term but after that she will return to her career in paediatric medicine.

Hundreds of party members came out to the Simcoe-Grey Conservative Electoral District Association nomination meeting at Stayner Collegiate Institute March 24, where they chose Dowdall as their candidate for Simcoe-Grey in the next federal election over Yeates, Marc Biss and Tim Bulmer – a third and fourth candidate to join the race.

When Simcoe Grey voters go to the polls in October 2019, it will be Dowdall's name on the ballot for the Conservatives, and given this

riding's history, he will likely be the next member of parliament.

Provincial

Since leaving the Progressive Conservative Party, Simcoe Grey MPP Jim Wilson has not made any public statements or appearances.

Simcoe-Grey MPP Jim Wilson resigned as Minister of Economic Development, Job Creation.

The announcement that he was stepping down from his cabinet post to seek treatment for addiction issues was made Friday, Nov. 2.

The following week, Premier **Doug** Ford told reporters that he forced Wilson to resign as a result of allegations of sexual misconduct, in addition to addiction issues as had been originally stated. Ford said Wilson had gone to rehab.

Although Wilson has resigned from his cabinet post, he is still the member of parliament for Simcoe-Grey.

Municipal

There was some added drama in the 2018 municipal elections when long-time Nottawa councillor Doug Measures announced in July that he would be running for mayor and councillor Janet Horner decided to run for mayor in Mulmur. And, they both won.

Bill McDougall steps away after decade at Station

Volunteer Spotlight


As a newcomer to Creemore in 2006, Bill McDougall got involved with Station on the Green shortly afterward.

This year, he has stepped away from his volunteer duties, after a decade on the Station board.

McDougall started off as a volunteer, doing landscaping, working with neighbour Paul Ruppel, learning about how to care for the facility and the fountain. McDougall and Ruppel looked after the building while other board members took care of the other duties. "Gradually you get more involved. You get sucked in," he said.

Twice, the fountain had to undergo a huge overhaul. Volunteers, using dental picks, scraped away calcium build-up to prepare it for re-bronzing.

McDougall said the first time, they installed a water softener to try to minimize the calcium deposits. It wasn't enough to soften the hard municipal water so the second time, they Bill McDougall installed a reverse



osmosis system.

Although he isn't the main organizer, McDougall has spent many days hauling books for the biannual Big Book Bash, the book sale that raises money to pay for the ongoing maintenance of the facility, and keep rental costs down.

McDougall said he is stepping away from his duties at this point to move

on, and make time to do projects at home. But no worries – he has written detailed procedure manuals about how everything works for the next maintenance crew.

He has also been involved with the

Clearview businesses that rely on trucking showed up at council chambers Monday in full force to advocate for upgrades to two major roadways. therefore negating the need for half load restrictions. The restrictions are meant to protect

roads from damage during the spring thaw by reducing the amount of allowable truck weight to five tons per axle. For the past year a group of residents,

acting as the Clearview Road Upgrade Committee, has been working to find a way to lift the restrictions and they have come forward with a proposal they are hoping Clearview will champion at the county level.

The committee represents businesses most affected by load restrictions on County Roads 9 and 42, also known acally as Aimort Road. The goal is to

a corridor that is unencumbered by load Stayner Rental owner Paul Van

Staveren and Creemore BIA past president Corev Finkelstein made the pitch Monday, requesting the township ask the County of Simcoe to use a new technology to stabilize a portion of both county roads, bringing them up to full load capacity, at a cost of \$3-million (or \$300,000 per kilometre). The new technology, as it was explained, would add a layer to absorb the weight of the trucks without damaging the road. This could be done at a fraction of the cost of what it would take to re-do the road.

The committee sees it as an investment in economic development that comes with several perks. Load restrictions, reported Deputy Mayor Barry Burton, are costing local businesses in excess of \$1.5-million annually in profits, add
