# Car goes into river: "It was cold, and it was flowing"

Last-minute Christmas shopping is always a bit of an adventure, but luckily it's not often as extreme as what Creemore resident **Angie Cook** and her 11-year-old twin sons **James** and **Alex Sprecker** experienced on December 23.

Like many of us, the trio headed out on a final dash to pick up a few gifts, in their case at about 1 pm with Collingwood as their destination. Unlike the rest of us, the vehicle they were in ended up lying on its side in the Batteaux River, its windows smashed out and many of its contents floating downstream.

"We were going up the Sixth Line, and the road was covered in slush," remembered Cook this week. "There was a lot of traffic, more than you usually see on that road, and I kept pulling over to the right to let people

pass. Just as we got close to the little hill that takes you up to County Road 91, I pulled over to the right again and suddenly the car was fishtailing all over the place."

At the bottom of the hill she's talking about, of course, is a bridge over the Batteaux River. Cook's SUV, a GMC Acadia, slid into the oncoming lane and struck the signpost alerting drivers that they're about to cross a bridge. It then flipped and plunged 15 feet into

"It was cold, and it was flowing," said Cook. "I remember the airbags popping and smashing the windows, and then I remember water rushing in."

Quickly ascertaining the state of her boys – both were alright but could not get out – Cook tried to open the (See "Mother" on page 5)




# Tom Montgomery honoured with Jubilee medal

Life-long Creemore resident **Tom Montgomery** received a Queen
Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal
at a family gathering on Christmas
Day

The medal, commissioned in honour of the Queen's sixtieth anniversary on the throne, was awarded through the Federation of Canadian Municipalities to Montgomery for his service to local organizations. The medal was presented by Montgomery's grandson **Scott Anderson**, a Councillor of the Township of Adjala-Tosorontio.

Montgomery belongs to the Masonic Nitetis Lodge, where he has served as secretary for 33 years. He is a life-member of the Eastern Star, and a charter member of the Manito Shrine Club in Collingwood. He has collected and delivered food to the Angus Food Bank for over 20 years.

His community involvement also extended to 48 years as the custodian of St. John's United Church, 24 years as a volunteer firefighter for the Creemore Fire Department, and eight years as an Emergency Management Ontario auxiliary constable.






# Branding and bridge issue are linked

Dear Editor:

I ask the readers of the *Echo* to answer a question. If Clearview Township wants to brand our area as a tourist destination, which do you think visitors would be drawn to see: a) a new concrete bridge deck or b) a restored early 20<sup>th</sup> Century iron bridge?

In 2013, Clearview Council will decide the issues of rebranding for Clearview and the Collingwood Street bridge. The two issues are linked. If we want to encourage tourism in Clearview, tourists need something that is out of the ordinary to see. Our tourist attractions are the cornerstones of the rebranding exercise. The Mill Street refurbishment, the view from Fairgrounds Road, Creemore Springs Brewery, the Jail, the Station, the Log House, the Horticultural Park and, yes, the old iron bridge on Collingwood Street are the attractions.

Clearview Council cannot proceed on these two decisions in isolation. These decisions are linked and affect in a profound way how Clearview will develop

its brand in the years to come. Get the big picture right and the rest will fall into place!



# Mother, sons okay after plunge into Batteaux River

passenger door, which was facing skyward, and found that it was pinned under several tree branches.

Just then, help arrived. Two men, who remain nameless, arrived on the scene and were able to clear the branches and open the passenger door. Cook and her sons were helped out of the car, out of the knee-deep water and up the bank to the road.

Another car stopped, and it was the mother of Taylor Dodd, one of the boys' classmates. Cook doesn't know the woman's first name, but is extremely grateful for what she did. Discovering that Cook's son James has diabetes, the woman – a diabetic herself – jumped into action, putting James in her car and helping him use his glucometer to test his blood sugar.

To the boys' dismay, several of their school library books were seen disappearing down the river, and a Christmas ornament that James had made for his dad also disappeared. But their hockey equipment was recovered, a little on the damp side but still in good

For Cook, the fact that all three people in the car came out of the crash without so much as a cut or a bruise was an early Christmas gift, and she admits that when December 25 arrived two days later, the family's celebrations were a little more emotional than usual, despite the lack of a few last-minute gifts.

"I'm so thankful that we weren't hurt, and I'm also so indebted to the people who helped us out in the river and on the road," she said. "We were very lucky that day."
